Introduction to Wooden Boat Building Course

Jan 26-27, Feb 23-24, Mar 16-17, Apr 13-14, May 18-19, Jun 22-23, Jul 13-14, Aug 24-25, Sep 14-15, Oct 12-13, Nov 16-17.

Students explore the art of boatbuilding in this two-day hands-on course, beginning with lofting, and moving on to the setup, steam bending and different methods of creating the back bone of small boats. They also learn planking methods, both carvel and lapstrake, and use of appropriate fasteners. After two days, students will have the knowledge, skill, and confidence to choose a design and style of boat to build on their own. (12 hours).
Fee: \$135. FoM: \$121.50.

Boat-in-a-Day Course

Jun 8, Jul 27, and Aug 17

Each participating team assembles a prepared kit for a small flat-bottomed plywood boat suitable for paddling. The boat is 12' long, 32" wide, and weighs about 40 lbs. Each boat will be completed to a watertight condition, and ready to take home for paint or varnish. Teams are limited to a maximum of 4 persons, at least one of whom must be an adult. (6 hours).
Fee: \$600. FoM: \$540. Minimum age: 8 yrs. old.

Build Your Own Stand-Up Paddle Board Course

Call to schedule
Participants build their own stand-up paddle board custom-fit to their size from cedar and plywood. Builders will be responsible for varnishing or painting their new boards at home after finishing the course. (24 hours).
Fee: \$1,000. FoM: \$900.



Lift Half- Model Making Course

Call to schedule
Students learn how to read a set of plans and use the basic woodworking tools most commonly found in a boatbuilder's tool kit to shape a lift half-model of a North Carolina Shad Boat. The models are completed in a step-by-step procedure ready to start applying a finish. (12 hours).
Fee: \$110. FoM: \$99.

Build a Stitch & Glue Kayak/Canoe

Call to schedule
Each participant in this class will use the stitch and glue method to build a boat, preselected in consultation with the instructor from a range of styles. Suitable types include performance kayaks 11-14 feet long, 17-foot sea/touring kayaks, 12 to 14-foot canoes, or a 12-foot pram or rowboat. Participants will complete their boats to the point when they are ready to take home to be painted and/or varnished. (60-72 hours).
Fee: \$750-\$1,250. FoM: \$675-\$1,125.

Paddle/Oar Making Course

Call to schedule
Participants can choose to make a canoe paddle, stand-up paddleboard paddle, kayak paddle, or pair of oars in this two-day class. Each participant will take home a paddle or pair of oars ready for paint or varnish. (12 hours).
Fee: \$275 for paddle; or \$325 for a pair of oars. FoM: \$247.50 for paddle; or \$292.50 for a pair of oars.

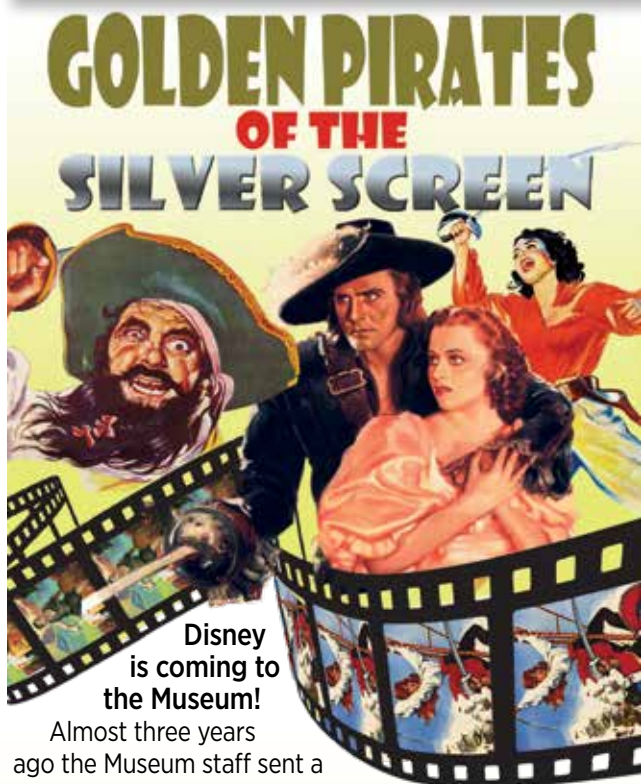

Almost three years ago the Museum staff sent a letter to the Walt Disney Archives requesting to borrow the costume worn by Ian McShane who played Blackbeard in the 2011 blockbuster film, *Pirates of the Caribbean: On Stranger Tides*. After three years of discussions, the costume will be temporarily displayed at our Museum starting December 2018. The loan of this costume inspired the Museum's exhibits department to design a whole new exhibit called *Golden Pirates of the Silver Screen*. The exhibit will feature costumes, posters, props, and merchandise representing about twenty different pirate-themed movies. The list ranges from classics such as Errol Flynn's *Captain Blood* (1935), to the more contemporary examples of *The Goonies* (1985) and *Cutthroat Island* (1995). The exhibit, *Golden Pirates of the Silver Screen* will officially open to the public following the Friends of the Museum Annual Membership meeting on Dec 2, 2018.

Coastal Culture and Waterfowl Watching Trip January 16-17
