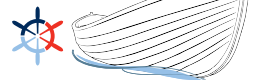

Introduction to Wooden Boat Building

January 28–29, February 25–26, March 25–26, April 22–23, June 10–11, September 23–24, November 11–12

Explore the art of boatbuilding in this two-day hands-on course, beginning with lofting, and moving on to the setup, steam bending and different methods of creating the backbone of small boats. You'll also learn planking methods, both carvel and lapstrake, and use of appropriate fasteners. After two days, you will have the knowledge, skill, and confidence to choose a design and style of boat to build on your own. (12 hours).

Lift Half Model Class

February 4–5, March 11–12

Learn how to read a set of plans and use the basic woodworking tools most commonly found in a boatbuilder's tool kit to shape a lift half-model of a North Carolina Shad Boat. The models are completed in a step-by-step procedure and then are taken home to apply a finish. (12 hours).

Lofting a Boat

March 18–19

Learn how to “loft,” the process of taking information from a boat plan and drawing it out in full scale in preparation for creating templates to build a boat. This is one of the first steps in many boatbuilding projects. For the purposes of this class, you will draw a six-foot boat.

Build a Boat in a Day

June 24, July 15, 22, 26, 29, August 5, 12, & 19

Each participating team assembles a prepared kit for a small flat-bottomed plywood boat suitable for paddling. The boat is 12' long, 32" wide, and weighs about 40 pounds. Each boat will be completed to a watertight condition and ready to take home for paint or varnish. Teams are limited to a maximum of 4 persons, at least one of whom must be an adult. (6 hours).

Fee: \$650. FoM: \$585. Minimum age: 8 yrs. old.

Build a Boat in a Day

Call to schedule

Each participating team assembles a prepared kit for a small flat-bottomed plywood boat suitable for paddling. The boat is 12' long, 32" wide, and weighs about 40 lbs. Each boat will be completed to a watertight condition and ready to take home for paint or varnish. Teams are limited to a maximum of 4 persons, at least one of whom must be an adult. (6 hours).

Multi-Day Boat Building Course

Each participant in this class will use the stitch and glue method to build a boat, preselected in consultation with the instructor from a range of styles. Suitable types include performance kayaks 11–14 feet long, 17-foot sea/ touring kayaks, 12 to 14-foot canoes, or a 12-foot pram or rowboat. Participants will complete their boats to the point when they are ready to take home to be painted and/or varnished. (60–72 hours).

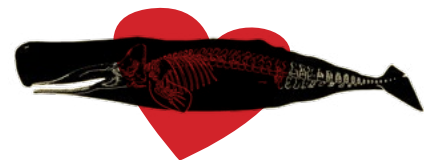

July 10-11, Aug. 8-9, 9 a.m.-noon

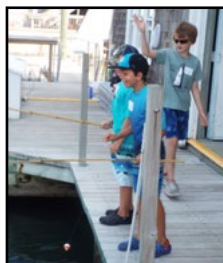

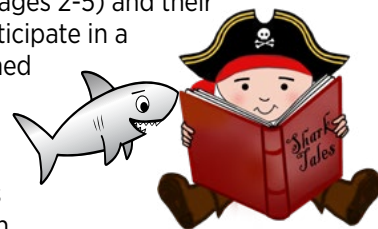


CHILDRENS PROGRAMS

JUNIOR SAILING PROGRAM *



The Junior Sailing Program offers sailing sessions for youth ages 8 and older. The Program teaches seamanship, from basic to more advanced, and competitive racing during Regatta Week.

Each participant is assigned a boat in which he or she will sail. Those students enrolled in the Optimist classes will sail alone, while the Club 420 is sailed with a two-person crew.

The Junior Sailing Program uses two classes* of sailboats that are commonly used in sailing and racing programs throughout the US.

International Optimist Dinghy (IOD or Opti)

The IOD is recognized worldwide as the sail-training and competition boat for youth ages 8-15 and is the ideal craft for teaching sailing to beginners. It has a single, sprit-rigged sail and is 7 feet 9 inches long. The Junior Sailing Program uses 20 IODs, all built at the Museum's Watercraft Center and maintained by staff and volunteers. The maximum student weight in the Opti is 130 lbs.

Club 420 (C420)

The C420 is 13 feet 9 inches long and has two sails—a mainsail and a jib. It carries a two-person team. Each crew member will learn to rig, launch, and sail this fun and fast daysailer. Racing fundamentals, tuning techniques, and proper boat handling will be covered. The program has six C420s. Students wishing to participate in the C420 class must have sailing experience and knowledge, preferably from at least one session of the Museum's Junior Sailing Program. Participants must weigh at least 100 lbs.

Participants in all sessions must:

- Be at least 8 years old when classes begin (NO EXCEPTIONS).
- Be able to successfully demonstrate their ability to swim.
- Have parent complete and return the Student Medical and Liability Release and Covid 19 Forms.
- Bring a US Coast Guard approved life jacket (PFD).

In addition, students should bring suitable clothing and accessories, including water shoes, a hat, sunscreen, and water bottle.

Junior Sailing is a Friends of the Museum program

Sailing sessions for youth ages 8 to 16 use the fun of sailing to teach boat handling and seamanship, from basic to more advanced, as well as competitive racing during Regatta Week. The program promotes self-reliance, awareness of safety, adaptability to the forces of nature; and develops self-confidence, sportsmanship, and respect for others, boats, and the sea.

Registration begins Jan. 17. The fee is \$435 per session. Members receive a \$35 discount per session. Sessions for Optis and C420s are offered. Sessions consist of one group in the morning from 8:30 a.m.–noon and another in the afternoon from 1 p.m.–4:30 p.m.

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Members of the Friends of the Museum in Beaufort receive a 10% discount on Port of Call Museum Store purchases and most programs. Museum programming and events are made possible through support from the Friends of the Museum in Beaufort.

Registration and Refund Policy for Museum Programs:

Advance registration is required for all paid programs. To register, call (252) 504-7758, visit the museum or sign up online at <https://ncmaritimemuseumbeaufort.com/events/>. Registration is confirmed only after payment is processed. Registration cut off for programs varies; for most field trips, children's programs, and tours it is the day prior at noon. For Watercraft Center Courses, cutoff for sign up is 2½ days prior to start of course. For group programs, call (252) 504-7743 for details and reservations.

Registration costs, less a 10% fee, are refunded when the museum receives cancellation notice at least 48 hours before the start of a program. There is no refund within 48 hours of the start of a program. Due to material costs and supply, Harvey W. Smith Watercraft Center Courses require a 2-week notification for cancellations; only the course fee is refunded if cancellation occurs prior to 2 weeks. The Museum reserves the right to cancel any program that does not meet the minimum participant requirement up to one week before the program is scheduled. In the event of cancellation due to low enrollment, participants who have submitted a fee will receive a full refund. If a program is canceled due to inclement weather and unable to be rescheduled for another date, the participants will receive a full refund.

Field trips into coastal habitats may involve travel by boat or van, and/or hiking or wading in shallow water. **Closed-toe shoes are required for safety on field trips.**
