North Carolina Maritime Museum in Beaufort

Summer 2024

The North Carolina Maritime Museum in Beaufort is in search of an energetic, and responsible student to fill the role of Education Intern for the Summer of 2024. The intern will assist with educational programs and operations as guided by the Curator of Education and Education section staff. Primary work will involve assisting with our ½ day Summer Science School classes which cover topics of sailors, fishing, and model boats. Other work includes welcoming museum guests and groups, answering questions about the museum, assisting volunteers, and assisting groups and visitors with museum led activities. This internship opportunity will be on a volunteer basis; a stipend may be available pending availability of funds.

The internship is a great opportunity for students pursuing a degree in various programs including education, history, biology, marine science, natural sciences, museum studies, and cultural resources. Students do not need to be enrolled in these specific programs, an interest in the museum and/or a desire to teach school age children is more important!

Position Requirements:

- Interest in the museum and/or teaching school age children.
- Must be 18 years of age or older.
- They should maintain a neat appearance and friendly, mature demeanor.
- It is preferred that the intern is certified in first aid and CPR, and comfortable working outdoors.
- Interns should dress appropriately while at work and program sites in the field. Presentable attire for a public museum setting is required.
- Interns must provide their own personal materials such as backpack, field clothing, appropriate footwear, water bottle etc., and required fishing license for fishing classes.
- The museum does not provide housing.
- A background check will be conducted on the selected candidate.

Schedule

Length of Internship: June 19, 2024 – August 8, 2024, not to exceed 144 hours.

Work Schedule: Monday – Friday, with some weekend work. No work on July 4th.

Hours: 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. on non-class days*

8:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. for Summer Science School class days

June 20, 21, 25, 26, July 9, 10, 17, 18, 25, 26, 30, 31, and August 7, 8 (these are critical attendance days)

*Non-class day schedules are flexible; At the request of the intern, and discretion of the supervisor, days and hours worked may be adapted.
